



AN IMPORTANT MESSAGE TO COMPETITIVE DRIVERS



When you hear “Safe Sport” do you think of driving safety issues?

Like the new ADS rule requiring protective vests on marathon. (You do know about that one, right?)

The new American Driving Society (ADS) Safety Vest rule reads:

To require protective vests that meet applicable domestic or international standards for everyone participating on a carriage during a marathon or any competition that includes marathon-type obstacles starting January 1, 2019. Junior requirements would be unchanged.

But, that's not what “Safe Sport” is all about ...

If you are a USEF member and are planning on competing in the upcoming USEF-sanctioned shows, including the new Grand Oaks CDE, please pay attention to this message.

**Even if you're not a competitor, please keep reading ...
“Safe Sport” is an important new federal law.**

What is the Safe Sport Authorization Act?

In Feb. 2018, President Trump signed the federal “**Protecting Young Victims from Sexual Abuse and Safe Sport Authorization Act of 2017**”, also known as the **Safe Sport Authorization Act**. This is an American law which establishes protection for young athletes. Among its provisions, it established the **United States Center for Safe Sport** as an independent entity to investigate reports of abuse and protect athletes from abuse in the United States Olympic movement.

So how does this affect you?

If you are USEF member, you must complete an online SafeSport Training Course in order to compete at a USEF show. Here is an excerpt from the formal announcement ...

US Equestrian Announces New SafeSport Training Requirements

by US Equestrian Communications Department
Nov 15, 2018

Lexington, KY – The US Equestrian Federation (USEF) announced a rule change on Tuesday, August 28, 2018 requiring that effective January 1, 2019 all USEF members 18-years-old and older, with a Competing Membership, must complete **SafeSport Training** in order to be eligible to participate in USEF activities, including competitions.

Please note: There are three modules to the training and all three must be completed in order to satisfy the requirement. The SafeSport Refresher course does not have to be completed until 1 year from the day you complete the three modules in the SafeSport Training.

To provide further guidance, (there is) a list of Frequently Asked Questions regarding the new rule change (on the USEF website www.usef.org).

The required SafeSport Training is on the U.S. Center for SafeSport website and is free for USEF members. Instructions on how to register for an account to access the training can be found (online). The training will take approximately 90 minutes to complete and consists of three modules: Sexual Misconduct Awareness Education, Mandatory Reporting, and Emotional and Physical Misconduct. **All three modules must be completed in order to satisfy the requirement.** The training does not have to be completed in one sitting; you can break it up to accommodate your schedule.

Final Note:

If you are not a USEF member, you do not have to complete the online training, but as a non-USEF member will be require to pay an additional \$45.00 “Show Pass” fee to compete at a USEF show.

1. Can you tell the Florida Whips about yourself and when/why you started driving?

"I've been driving for 20+ years. I started driving when my children were young we had a pony that they drove. He was a Welsh Roadster pony who was a barrel of fun. But, I didn't drive again for many years. I had a friend who took me to a driving show fairly close to where I lived. She said we should go and look at it at Valhalla, which was my first experience with Combined Driving. I'd never heard or seen it before. I kept watching and watching, saying to my friend, my mare could do this so, I went right home and told my husband to start looking for a cart and harness. It only took me three days. First day, I ground drove my mare. Second day, I had my husband pull the cart beside, in front and all around her. Third day, we hitched her up & went down the road and that was my start in combined driving!"

2. What is your favorite driving discipline and why?

"OK, it's Combined Driving. I like combined driving because it covers all the phases of horse disciplines. It covers dressage which is the training part of the horse, it's got an adrenalin rush on the marathon and then its got precision in cones where you and your horse must communicate properly to do something that is very precise."

3. Please tell us about your equine and your favorite carriage?

"I started out with a lippitt Morgan mare and bred her to a government bred stallion and got the horse that my mare is now out of. I drove that mare for a number years and did very very well with her. I bred her twice, the first time to Funquest Eric and got a big gelding that decided he'd rather be a jumper than a carriage horse. Second time I bred her to a Welsh Cobb stallion "Dafydd" simply

because I felt he had every single thing that my mare was short of. Her foal is my current horse, a third-generation home bred mare. She was suppose to be born on March 17 and she wasn't born until March 31. That night I went out to the barn at 10 o'clock at night to check on our mare and there was the foal. Just before that I said to my husband she's going to be an April baby and when I said she almost made April, well there's her name "Almost April"! "My favorite carriage is a "TH"... I think it's a fabulous carriage."

4. What are some of your most rewarding driving accomplishments and memories?

"I have three, (driving Almost April's Mom). First, we won the State Fair Novice Champion Pleasure horse after she had only been hitched for three months and also won every class we entered. My second, with that same mare, won best marathon at Live Oak where we won five out of six hazards, took second in number six hazard only because she was going so fast I had to stop her and back her up. Third, was showing at Gloria Austins we won Concourse de Elegance. A picture of us hitched was on the poster for the following years Pleasure show."

5. What are your future driving goals?

"I'd like to bring Almost April up to surpass her Mom. Her Mom has quite a few accomplishments and I think April has a little better chance to be better than her and I'm hoping to get there."

6. Many know you host numerous driving events at your farm. What got you interested in hosting events and what's the next event on your calendar?

"We had a Barry Hunter Clinic last week and there were so many entries that we're doing another one on Tuesday. We're doing an HDT in April. On Tuesdays we try to have at least one clinic a month, sometimes two a month. Olof is the trainer we try to get out here fairly often so we have alot of Olof Clinics. Mostly I like having people come out to help them get going in driving."

7. What made you interested in opening your farm to drivers?

"Number one I'm just lucky to have a beautiful farm that's perfectly set up for driving. Early on we put in a dressage ring and some hazards. When I came up through driving there were a lot of people who shared their knowledge with me and helped me along my way, I wanted to do the same thing for new drivers. I think that driving is the best of all the equine disciplines. I've seen a lot of the equine disciplines. Carriage drivers, when it comes to true sportsmanship, are right at the top of the list because they care about each other and they care about their horses."

Thank you Lynda, you are an inspiration and a true mentor to all in our driving community!

A History of the Florida Whips

The Florida Whips was organized around 1981, by Phillip Hoffman and Metta Baxter. Mr. Hoffman was a retired executive from J&J and owned the Wycombe Stud in Ocala, driving a pair of high stepping Warmbloods. Metta drove a single Morgan raised on her Double M Morgan Horse Farm near Newberry, Florida. She was known as the “doyenne of Morgans and driving” in Florida. Meetings in the early years were mostly potluck lunches and picnic drives at the individual farm and friendly non-competitive get-togethers. Bob and Helen Tolmach’s Kanapaha Morgan Horse Farm and Metta’s Double M Morgan Horse Farm were early venues for the leisurely picnic drives. Russ Hardwick hosted drives near his Hardwick Hideaway in the Ocala Forest. Susan Gilliland was interviewed by our local TV channel at one of these drives as carriage driving in Florida was so unique (I still have a tape copy of that interview.) Most of the people hosting drives were officers in the newly formed club. Soon many of the pleasure picnic drives were held at various state parks, for example, Oleno and San Felasco State Parks.

In 1989, the Florida Whips volunteered at the first Combined Driving Event held in Tampa, Florida, under the aegis of Gladstone. Whips drivers enthusiastically embraced this new sport, driving all singles horses first, put to easy entry carts and a few Meadowbrooks. Soon after, Susan Gilliland organized the first Combined Driving Event in Florida. Competitors would drive cones and dressage at the Ocala Breeders Pavilion, then pack up and travel a few miles to Live Oak Plantation for the marathon. That event evolved into the prodigious Live Oak International CAI CDE.

That opened the floodgates for competitive driving in Florida. Soon the Quigleys of Lake City hosted the Valhalla CDE where many of us got our start in competitive driving. Bob and I (Helen) drove a Bird-in-Hand Flyer, which had a reach and could not make a 90 degree turn. There was not a single marathon vehicle on the course. Ray and Pam Knisley started their Treasure Coast CDE in Ft. Pierce, which ran for at least 5 years and many more Whips were bitten by the competitive bug. Now we started to see a few Kuhnles and some other brands of marathon vehicles, which became part of our vocabulary. Louise Stokes ran a CDE at Basenstoke Farm for a couple of years and then we saw Maureen and Alan Aulson driving a pair of Morgans at a one time CDE at the Heavens Gate Farm. They had bought some property adjoining Goethe Forest in Morrilton and Louise persuaded them to host a CDE on short notice in the spring of 2003, when the Basenstoke Farm owner suddenly quit.

Black Prong was a huge hit and developed into a major driving complex, the Black Prong Equestrian Center. The Treasure Coast event moved their dates to Black Prong and became the Nature Coast CDE. Steeplechase grew up in the shadows of all of this driving and now hosts some competitive fun events of their own.

Now that we had competitive driving, we needed clinics with experts to help us learn to do all of this dressage, cones and hazards. One of the first clinics was given by George Bowman, of England, at Otto’s in Ocala. Bob was taking a lesson when George Bowman in his strong English accent said “Enter at “I”. Bob looked around and said he didn’t see any “I”. It turned out “I” was the Cockney English pronunciation for “A”. Gloria Austin, who had been an early Whips supporter, moved to Florida and bought property near Weirsdale, which would become Continental Acres. She held various pleasure drives there and one year Continental Acres and the Whips hosted the Annual ADS Weekend of Driving. This 3 day clinic, with some of the best drivers in the country as instructors, became hugely successful and was continued by Francine Arrington and now by Connie Thoreson and Linda Evans.

In the early 1990s, Metta, still a driving force in the Whips, realized that to expand interest in carriage driving, we had to teach neophytes the harnessing, training and driving techniques. She and Katherine Gordon, a Whips member and director of Community Education at Santa Fe Community College, talked the college into offering a community education course entitled “Teaching Your Horse to Drive”. This intensive 2-day course was entirely run by the Whips volunteers at Metta’s farm. Tuition was split between the College and Metta (who turned her share over to the Northern Region treasurer). She recruited Helen and Bob Tolmach as volunteer assistants early on and when Metta’s health began to fail, the class was moved to their farm. During these years, attendance of 8 to 10 was sketchy and dependent on weather and word of mouth publicity. There was a massive change about 2005 when Helen and Bob were exposed to the University of Florida’s IFAS Horse Teaching Facility. Their neighbor, Joel McQuagge, manager of the facility, invited us to move the course to his heated classrooms and massive covered arena. We now have a waiting list for the 30 spaces and of these, many graduates immediately take membership in the Whips.

You can see there has been a grand evolution in our Florida driving community. We came from backyard driving on our own farms to some of the biggest CDEs in the country with some of the world’s best drivers.
